President's Message



Your Quilt Show Team will be handing out Opportunity Quilt tickets and advertising flyers at the August meeting. Remember that it is your responsibility to pay for these tickets. We appreciate your prompt payment—oh and don't forget to bring your address labels with you so you don't have to write your name thirty times!

At the recent board meeting, I suggested that we enlist the assistance of friendship groups to assist the guild when necessary. I spend a good deal of time pondering the possibilities of boosting the participation of guild members. Simply asking for volunteers has been a pointless waste of breath. Therefore, I thought friendship groups might be a source to help with tasks that need doing. Let me explain. First, this proposal has no impact on your group's normal meetings or activities. Second, I don't need to know who is in your group or where you meet. All I am asking for is your help. Since your group knows one another well, and one can assume you enjoy one another's company, it makes sense that if members of your friendship group volunteered to assist the guild, it would be far more enjoyable to be with friends rather than doing it alone. This also provides the opportunity to go to lunch and shopping—two of our favorite activities.

At the August Guild Meeting, I am going to make this plea again. I am optimistic that there will be volunteers to sell additional Opportunity Quilt Raffle Tickets. The quilt must be taken to various venues such as quilt shows, quilt stores, craft shows and/or guilds and placed on display, and this requires 3-4 volunteers to set-up, sell and take down the quilt. Usually this is at a local location for one day. **Linda Card has more dates and details about these activities.** I know this is a sacrifice of your personal time, but is it also your opportunity to

repay the guild for all of the enjoyment you receive by being a member. Please consider donating your time to help.

Perhaps this is an appropriate time to remind all guild members both experienced and new that we have obligations to fulfill:

- ✓ We are a working guild, and our guild members are **expected** to volunteer for positions and activities to help operate the guild and its community programs other than the quilt show.
- ✓ Members are required to
 - volunteer time to help organize and setup the yearly Quilt Show, **and** volunteer to work 3-4 hours each day of the show on Friday and Saturday to help in a variety of areas;
 - complete two community security quilts each year that are donated to hospice, local police and other community service organizations (all materials are provided by the guild);
 - sell or **purchase** opportunity quilt tickets (\$25) to help fund student scholarships.

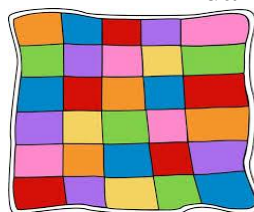

5. Looking forward to our Mystery Quilt reveal at our Valley Quilters guild meeting on the 23rd!!!

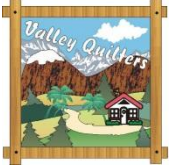
