President's Message



Wow it is already July, and the quilt show is just around the corner! I'm sure you have those important dates circled on your 2017 calendar, right? If not, do it now; they are February 10 & 11, 2017. I know you are unsure why I am already bugging you about the upcoming show, but I think it is important to inform members—especially new members—about what needs to happen **before** the show begins. **We MUST do better than we did last year.**

- Soon the Quilt Show Team—Linda Card, Janie Currey and Johnnie D' Alessandro will be distributing a packet with 30 Opportunity Quilt Raffle Tickets to each member. It is each member's responsibility to pay for these tickets (\$25.00) with a personal check or by selling ALL of them to friends or family. **This money funds our scholarships so we need every penny we can get.**
- Each member will also receive a group of advertising fliers that need to be distributed to every organization and business in Hemet, San Jacinto and Southern California. Give several of them to your nail and hair salon, dentist, doctor, vet, insurance agent, AAA, dog groomer, restaurant, relatives, quilt stores to display and handout. . . . you get the idea. Everyone you meet; the more the better.
- Now the tough ones: We desperately need volunteers for the following upcoming functions:
 - ✓ To sell additional Opportunity Quilt Raffle Tickets, the Quilt must be taken to various venues such as quilt shows, quilt stores, craft shows and/or guilds and placed on display. This requires 3-4 volunteers to set-up, sell and take down the quilt, usually this is at a local location for one day. **Linda Card has more dates and details about these activities. Please contact her if you are willing to help. We need YOU.**
 - ✓ In November, we will begin having members signup for working at the quilt show. Last year we had several people who did not volunteer to work at the show and several who signed up but never showed up. We hope to alleviate that problem this year so the workload is spread more fairly.

Of course, this is only a part of what needs to be accomplished before the show begins. So, I'll provide more information next month.

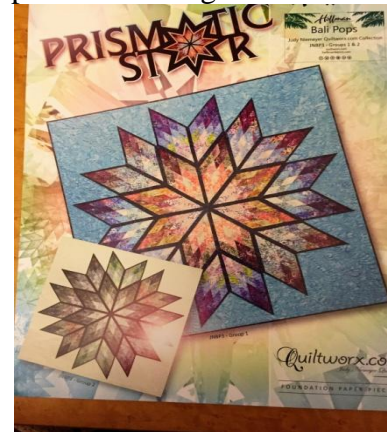

Please welcome our two new members Nancy Bogue and Kathy Ray. See you all in July.

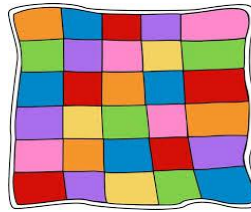
