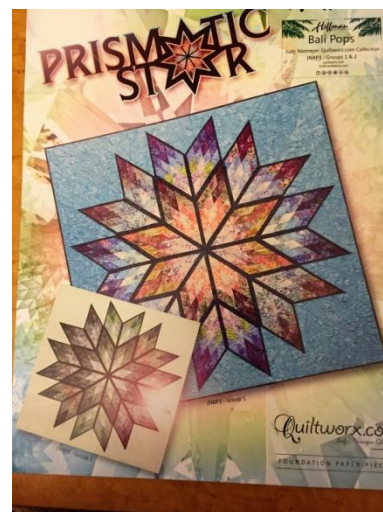
Hi Valley Quilters!



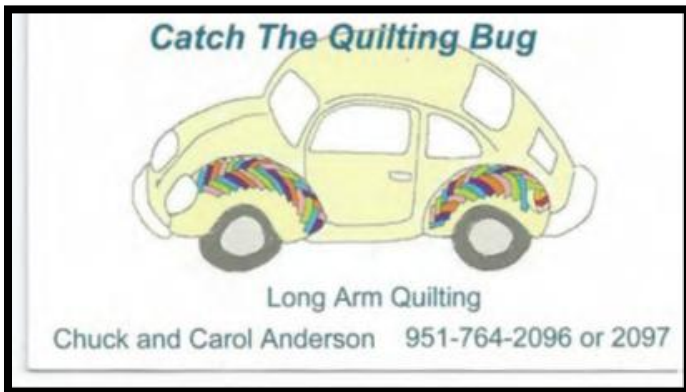
