Hi everyone!


We have the first week covered for the Quilt run. We could have sold tickets two weeks, but we didn't have enough interest. This is for Scholarships for teens going to college.

I hope you are enjoying making these Blocks of the Month. This month we have 2 blocks to make. Block 5 is called the Lily flower. Lilies come in various colors of White, Yellow, Pinks Orange, and some Purples.

Fun Fact for the Lily Flower:

Believed to bring Good Luck

In Asia, Lily blubs are cultivated and used for food

Blubs/plants used to treat various medical ailments

Plants are very toxic to animals

Block 6 is called the Aster flower. Aster flowers are mostly purple and pink.

Fun Facts for the Aster Flower:

Over 600 varieties

Flowers were smoked in Ancient Times to ward off wicked serpents


Plants were used to treat pain of Sciatica and Muscle spasms.
