We had a living room where she set up the quilting frame where she sat to quilt and taught us to quilt. She never took out a stitch that anyone helping made, even though it might have been called a "Toe Hold". She just quilted around it and said that it was a stitch made with love and was to stay with the quilt.

So, with the thought of Mother's Day this month, I hope you reflect on who was your inspiration and if you have children, what you tried to inspire in them.

We have several ideas for future mini workshops but have no fixed dates yet. Please bring your ideas to Kathy Smigun so we can schedule them.




